

# THE CAKE TIN

## CAKE COLLECTION GUIDE

### COLLECTION ADDRESS

35 Bellars Lane, Malvern WR142DJ

To get here I suggest approaching from Guarlford Road. Turn onto Eston Avenue and drive all the way to the end. At the T junction, turn right onto Bellars Lane. Number 35 is the 5<sup>th</sup> house on the left. The number is on the gate up the driveway. You'll see my red car, branded with The Cake Tin, directly outside.

### COLLECTION TIME

We will agree a collection time when you confirm your order. If anything changes, please please let me know as soon as possible. My number is 07747073389. Text is usually best as I'm not always able to answer the phone if I'm busy baking or decorating

### CONTACTLESS COLLECTION

When you arrive, ring the bell and I'll come out to meet you at the gate. In order to maintain social distancing, instead of passing the cake directly to you, I will bring the box out and place it on a table by the gate. I will still show you the cake before you leave the premises to make sure you are happy. You won't need to come into the house so there's no need for a mask. If it's raining, I'll provide a cover to place over the box until you get safely to your car.

### TRAVELLING WITH YOUR CAKE

I want your cake to be as perfect when it arrives at your party as when it leaves my kitchen x

Always remember, cake is delicate. While I set your cake in the fridge ready to travel, please remember it is still only held together by butter icing!

**\*\*\*Tilting or shaking movements may cause the butter icing to become unstable and the layers or decorations to shift\*\*\***

Don't be scared of travelling with cake, but do be mindful of how you drive. Drive smoothly, turn slowly and avoid heavy braking!!

I strongly recommend travelling with your cake in the boot of the car, or if that's not possible, in the passenger foot-well. Try to avoid travelling with your cake on the seats as this will cause it to be tilted for the duration of the journey. If you can, bring a dry flannel tea towel with you, or some kitchen roll. I use both these methods to stop the box sliding around in the boot.

Your cake will be in a cardboard travel box and on a sturdy cake drum but you will still need to take care. The cake box sides will flex in and out, so please remove any items from the area that could knock into the box.

If you don't feel confident collecting your cake, or for whatever reason you're not able to collect, just let me know and we can organise delivery

### **STORING YOUR CAKE AT HOME**

I recommend collecting your cake on the day you plan to serve it, however if you need to store it overnight, please let me know and I'll make appropriate suggestions for storage. I have a range of boxes to hire that will accommodate tall cakes.

Once cut, any leftovers will definitely need to be stored in an airtight container.
